REPRESENTING GOD!

I want to look at the Queen of Sheba’s visit to Solomon as recorded in 2 Chron. 9. It is a great example of when a person is truly seeking answers, God will reward them. The queen ended up with all she desired and took back more than she brought (9:12). I want to take a closer look at a statement the queen made to Solomon before she returned home. She told Solomon, “*Blessed be the Lord your God, who has delighted in you and set you on his throne as king for the Lord your God! Because your God loved Israel and would establish them forever, he has made you king over them, that you may execute justice and righteousness*” (9:8). I thought this was an interesting observation from this pagan queen to recognize the work of God in Solomon’s life. I also feel that she gives us three traits we need to exhibit in our own lives as we go about representing God. First, to represent God, we need to show that God is in our life. Our lives need to look different than the world. Our lives need to look like God! Secondly, to represent God, we need to be fair in our judgments and our actions. The Queen of Sheba knew that Solomon showed these traits to those in his kingdom; the world needs to see that in us too. Lastly, to represent God, we need to live righteous lives. We can’t lead anyone to Christ if we talk like the world, if we look like the world, and if we act like the world. We were created to do our King’s work and to show the world what Jesus looks like. We do live in a fallen world, but God loves his creation and needs us to represent Him to the lost.
