LESSONS FROM THE GARDEN

Our goal as a Christian is to become more like Jesus. Taking a look at Jesus' betrayal and arrest can give us some traits of Jesus that we need to copy in our own lives. We see Jesus' courage. When all His followers had left Him, Jesus never faltered, He never wavered. He knew the difficulty of the task He was given, yet He never questioned His Father's will. He never made excuses; He never blamed anyone for His lot. He continued His walk and finished His job. We see Jesus' authority. His capture, His surrender, His arrest, were all done with His consent. We too need to live with the authority that God has given us. We don't have to live like others in this world. We don't have to compromise our morals. Life is better when we live it in the name of Jesus. We see Jesus' choice to die. Jesus chose to do his Father's will by going to the cross. We too, have that choice to make. In order to gain Heaven we must die to self, we must die to sin, and we must willingly and totally surrender our life to God. Our nature makes this difficult. We see Jesus' love for others. Jesus healed Malchus' ear out of his love for the man. He prevented his disciples' arrest out of his love for them. He washed the feet of Judas, the traitor, out of love. Our love for others is shown by our actions, not our talk. It is shown by our willingness to sacrifice for others. We see Jesus' obedience. In spite of the hardships He was to face, in spite of the suffering He was to bear, and in spite of a world where many would not take advantage of His sacrifice, Jesus said, “Thy will be done!” To become more like Jesus, we need to be more about “the will of our Father”.

Option 2). Attend our Summer Speaker Series in the auditorium which has great speakers, topics, and issues relative to all of our lives.

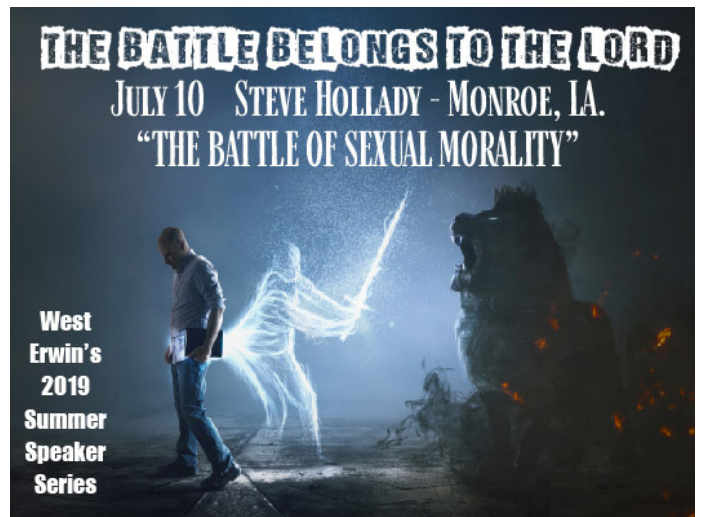
