#### TAKING OFFENSE

In John 6 we see Jesus speaking in the synagogue at Capernaum. Jesus said some things that were hard for people to hear. In fact, many of his disciples said, "This is a hard saying, who can listen to it?" (6:60). Jesus then asked his disciples, "Do you take offense at this?" I believe there were many times that people took offense at some things Jesus said. Jesus did not say things just to hurt people's feelings; Jesus told people what He knew they needed to hear! When Jesus engaged with people, He did not talk around the issues and He did not take time getting to the point. Jesus spoke about things like the judgment. Jesus talked about the cross and what it meant to the world. Jesus also talked about people's heart, how to protect it, and what to store up in it. Jesus talked about sin, greed, and the problem of using one's position with God to profit from it. Jesus talked about faith and living by the Spirit. Jesus talked about how a lack of belief could harm one's relationship with God. Jesus also talked about taking your relationship with God serious. Yes, it is easy to see how Jesus could hurt someone's feelings. In fact, we see where many of Jesus' followers turned back and no longer followed him (6:66). It is sad to say, but that trend has continued even today. When people leave Jesus, where do they turn next? We all need to remember what Peter said when Jesus asked his disciples if they were leaving too. Peter replied, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life" (6:68). When Jesus' words offend us it is because he is trying to tell us what we need!

Henry Ward Beecher wrote the following: "All men are tempted. There is no man that lives that can't be broken down, provided it is the right temptation, put in the right spot."

This brings to mind I Peter 5:8-9, "Be sober, be vigilant, because your adversary the devil walks about like a roaring lion seeking whom he may devour. Resist him, steadfast in the faith, knowing that the same sufferings are experienced by your brotherhood in the world."

We learn from James 1:12, "Blessed is the man who endures temptation for when he has been approved, he will receive the crown of life which the Lord has promised to those who love Him."

Finally, in I Cor. 10:13, Paul reminds us stating, "No temptation has overtaken you except such as is common to man; but God is faithful, who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation will also make the way of escape, that you may be able to bear it."
