BLESSED ARE THOSE WHO ARE FAVORED BY GOD!

“Blessed are those who have learned to acclaim you, who walk in the light of your presence, O Lord. They rejoice in your name all day long; they exult in your righteousness. For you are their glory and strength, and by your favor you exalt our horn” (Psa.89:15-17). These verses from the 89th Psalm talk to us of the blessedness of those that “know” the incomparable God. By knowing, I mean those that have obeyed His gospel and are doing their best to walk in the light as John wrote of (1 Jo. 1:7). One of the most beautiful parts of this passage is the idea of walking in the light of God's presence or walking in the “favor” of God. So, what does it look like when someone lives in the favor of God? First, for those who are favored by God we rejoice in God's name on a daily basis! One of the easiest ways to let people know about the saving power of God is to be heard praising Him always. When we praise Him to others we are telling them of God love for a broken world. Thirdly, for those who are favored by God our walk with God brings glory to Him! When we succeed in times of weakness we bring glory to God. When we beat the struggles of life we bring glory to God. When we stand for him, we bring glory to God. Are you walking in the light of God's presence and bringing glory to God?

“For the mind set on the flesh is death, but the mind set on the Spirit is life and peace.” Romans 8:6 NASB

There is a term known as the “anchoring effect”. Parents use it to outwit their teenagers. If your teen wants to stay out till midnight but you want them home by 11:00 p.m., start out by offering them 10:00 p.m. Then when you meet in the middle they think it's a compromise! Nope, just an old anchoring trick.

Savvy retailers do the same with sales. They put things on sale, you feel great, and the sale price was artificially inflated.

The implications and applications of anchoring are profound. If the battle is won or lost in the mind then where you drop your anchor will dictate the outcome. The writer of Hebrews refers to hope as an anchor. A ship's anchor doesn't just keep it from drifting. An anchor can be thrown in front of a ship to help navigate it through treacherous channels. Hope is anchoring ourselves to God's promise. Peace is found the same way. So is joy. For better or for worse your focus determines your reality.
